Dear Parishioners,

I read somewhere of a commentator who remarked that they initially felt that the judgement pronounced on the foolish virgins in today's gospel was unduly harsh! Why were the wise virgins so unkind and unhelpful to their foolish and less wise sisters? And, as I reflect on this very familiar parable, I am tempted to ask the same question... Why on earth did not the wise and prepared bridesmaids not share their oil, in a Christian spirit, with their desperate fellow bridesmaids? But on further reflection one may be tempted to change one's opinion, as my earlier commentator did. The significance of the use of the words 'wise virgins' really lies in the readiness or otherwise of the wise individuals awaiting the bridal party's arrival. In spite of knowing that the Bride would come at an unexpected time, not all the attendants prepared themselves for the unexpected. Oil was an essential component of life and its living, it was central to so much of living. Not to have reckoned that into one's life calculations was a huge miscalculation bordering on utter carelessness. Listening to today's gospel forces us to remind ourselves that Jesus has told us on numerous occasions that the Lord will come at a time we do not expect. That has been the theme of many of his stories and admonitions. We have been told often to be prepared.

When we reflect on the surprising fact that the five prepared bridesmaids failed to share their oil we come to realize that there are some things that one cannot borrow from others. As one commentator remarked 'we cannot borrow someone else's faith, someone's grace, someone else's spirituality,' in other words we cannot borrow someone else's preparedness! We can blame others for many things in our lives but eventually we have to account for our own soul and how we present it to God. Being prepared for the Lord's coming does not need great insight or extraordinary preparations or extraordinary feats of holiness but rather it consists in trying to do the ordinary things of life, those chores that are part of daily living, with love and kindness. The challenge is to try to live faithfully our particular vocation, whether married or single, professional or otherwise, rich or poor, in such a way as to be prepared for the gift of eternal life.
