Dear Parishioners,

As we approach the end of the Church's liturgical year our gospel readings are frequently parables about preparing ourselves for meeting with the Lord. This week's gospel parable is about how three different individuals reacted in life to the gifts and talents bestowed on them by God. In all the gospel stories it is a given that we are all endowed with gifts or talents, the only issue of concern is how we have used the talents that God gives us. One of the more surprising aspects of all the talent parables in the gospels, lies in the fact that God never tells us how to use the talents we have been given! We are, apparently, expected to use our own initiative and ingenuity.

In today's account, three different people are given varying talents, two of them increase the talents they were given and one did nothing with it, and was subsequently condemned. The first thing to notice is that we are not all born equally talented. Even in the story as told by Jesus, one person received five talents, another two and a third one. In this modern age, we often speak of 'all being equal' and that is true; but it is an equality in human rights, not in ability. It is obvious to one and all that we have different intellectual and different physical abilities, different genetic inheritances, different sporting, musical and artistic abilities and so on. Our giftedness can be significantly different to that of other people we know well, but all of us have our own unique talents. In today's First Reading from the Book of Proverbs, we are reminded in an eloquent passage of the talent of the virtuous wife who has the skill of raising a family, of running a household of caring for a spouse. The same must be said of a faithful and diligent husband. The real question raised in today's gospel parable concerns whether we are aware of being talented and whether we used those talents in a loving, fruitful and life giving manner. The issue is not how talented we are compared to others, nor is it about how many talents we actually have, but rather do we appreciate that God has gifted all of us in a unique fashion. The question is 'have we appreciated the gifts bestowed on us and have we used them well? Today, Scripture reminds us that we shall someday have to account for our talents and how we used them
