Dear Parishioners,

Although today's scripture consists of the reading for the opening verses of St Mark's gospel, in it we are introduced to two great Christian characters that loom large in our gospel narrative. Here at the very opening of the Evangelist's account of Jesus and his story, we meet with Jesus Christ and his cousin John the Baptist. We meet John the Baptist in person, in the flesh, but we meet Jesus himself as he is introduced by John as the One to take away the sins of the world.

What a very dramatic introduction by John, and yet these same words are used by us every week when we find ourselves in the presence of the Eucharist. Once again, we find ourselves sitting or kneeling again this year at the beginning of Advent, preparing again to welcome Jesus as the Saviour of the World. It is our reminder of the ever new and ever ancient mystery of the Incarnation, when Jesus came to walk among us once again. And although we have said the same prayers over and over again, we hope and pray that through the years, we trust that they will still be on our lips when we are caught up in the great glory and mystery of the final gift of God.

One of the lovely things about the Christmas Story is this characteristic of un-changeableness in the story itself. It is not merely the story of the birth of a baby but, even more importantly, it is our involvement in the mystery of life and in the unfathomable mystery of life's journey. Whether it is the children caught up in entrancement of the shepherds and sheep, or the mysterious star appearing in the skies and leading the Wise Men from the East, all of this is part of the welding together the marvellous elements of story and mystery that's come together in the celebration of Christmas.

With the appearance of John the Baptist in today's gospel, there is the beautiful reminder that even John, who was so committed to the ministry of Jesus, wondered if he was following the right Messiah. Remember, it was John who sent disciples to Jesus to ask "Are you the one who is come, or look we for another?" As we prepare for the celebration of the birth of our saviour we have to remind ourselves that we can lose sight of the mystery of God in our midst. There are so many things vying for our attention and our notice, that we sometimes have to battle to anchor our faith in the age-old traditions of our faith, traditions and scripture.
