#### Dear Parishioners,

Speaking last week in Church we remarked that St Mark introduced us to the two principal figures of the Advent season of preparation, namely Jesus himself and the great St John the Baptist. John the Baptist is a somewhat ethereal figure and it is in ways difficult to pin him down. He is both attractive and a little off-putting, inviting and, at the same time, a little frightening. But he has the marvellous gift of clarity concerning himself and is not living in cuckoo- land or prancing around full of illusions and big noting himself.

One occasionally hears of people who think they are the cheese and, in fact, they are merely the silver paper. There is the temptation for many of us to exaggerate our own significance or importance. Such was certainly not the situation in John's case, he lived with his two feet firmly on the ground. John knew his role in God's plan, he was the pre-eminent announcer of Jesus, he came to prepare the ground for Jesus as Messiah. He was the cousin of Jesus and part of the family of Jesus, but utterly untouched by envy or jealousy. He was more than happy to stand up in public and to proclaim the uniqueness and importance of Jesus, in fact he made the marvellous comment about Jesus "He must increase and I must decrease".

As we gradually approach the climax of the season with the birth of Our Saviour, we might try and reflect on the profound faith and humility of the Baptist as he stands before his followers and urges them to forget about him and to embrace the presence of Jesus. All of us, without exception, find ourselves caught up in the many preparations for Christmas, many really important for our families and our children and communities. It would not be fair to expect us to drop all that, too many peoples' happiness and celebrations depend on us. But it might be helpful to think a little of John the Baptist who never forget the centrality of Jesus and how important it was to keep him in the main frame. As we happily prepare for the happiness of our families and communities at this time of magnificent celebration, let us constantly remind ourselves, our families and our children why we are celebrating, and how absolutely essential Jesus is to the real meaning of Christmas.
