1st Reading

Acts 10:34, 37-43

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

addressed Cornelius Peter and his household: 'You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him. Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses - we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead – and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear

this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

Pastoral Letter to the Clergy and Faithful of the Archdiocese of Sydney regarding the latest restrictions in response to the COVID -19 pandemic 30 March 2020

All Australians are experiencing hardship at this time as we seek to limit the spread of the Coronavirus. Many people are being asked to make great sacrifices: our health professionals working long hours and risking their own health; those who have lost their jobs; businesses that have had to close; parents struggling to care for their children while 'working from home'; and so on. As Catholics, our greatest sacrifice is being unable to gather to celebrate the sacraments or even to spend time praying in a church. Gatherings are limited to two people.

Live-streaming of Holy Week Services

These live-streaming services will be trimmed down and shortened (e.g. no palm procession, no washing of the feet, no kissing the cross except by the celebrant, no Easter fire) to maintain the viewers interest. "Mass for You at Home" is broadcast on Channel 10 each Sunday from 6am. There are several live-streaming and on-demand services for daily Mass both locally and from around the English-speaking world. See the Archdiocese of Sydney website for links to viewing mass at the St Mary's Cathedral and other parishes who are live-streaming Mass. While live-streaming, the church must remain closed and the faithful may not congregate outside, nor may the clergy come out of the church to distribute palms or Holy Communion (as this would encourage illegal gatherings).

Closure of Churches

At this stage, the directions in my pastoral letter of 23 March continue to apply regarding church closures, no public gatherings for Mass, private prayer and other services, Sunday observance, annual duties, Baptisms, Anointing, pastoral visits and clergy availability. Any weddings only five people can be present (encourage to postpone) and at funerals only ten people present (can offer to do memorials later in the year).

Confessions

Because First Rite Confessions are by definition a meeting of two people these are unaffected. However, they cannot be conducted in churches or in a way that encourages groups of people to gather in one place. Some are trying outdoors confessions; others in the presbytery or people's homes. Current advice on distancing (4sqm), hygiene, hand sanitiser etc should be followed. Confessions are offered by strict "Appointment only" through the Parish Office.




