Sacred Music – Workshop for Congregants

When: Saturday 29th April 2023, 9am-1:30pm Where: St Thomas Parish Hall, 3 Thomas Street,

Lewisham, NSW 2049.

Presenters: Australian Sacred Music Association

Limit: 50 people. Register on-line.

The purpose of this course is to train and form the faithful to engage more fully in the sung liturgy. The course is designed to help congregants with no prior practice or experience of singing the parts of the Mass as found in the 2011 Typical Edition of the Roman Missal. This one day workshop will outline the theoretical foundations of sacred music (biblical, historical, and magisterial), as well as equip each participant

with an opportunity to advance in the practical art of 'active participation' by singing the liturgy.



<u>Sacred Music – Workshop for Parish Cantors</u> and Musicians

Presenters: Australian Sacred Music Association Limit: 25 people. Register on-line.

The purpose of this course is to train and form Parish Musicians to lead the sacred music in their parish setting. This one day workshop is designed to equip Parish Musicians (with confident vocal skills and good music literacy) to sing the texts of the liturgy and understand the various parts of the music of the Mass: Common, Ordinary, Proper, Hymns, Instrumental. The necessary pre-requisite for this course is a recommendation from one's parish priest confirming one's basic knowledge of music. For absolute beginners, the course "Sacred Music – Congregants" is recommended as a good place to start their journey with sacred music. More information: https://

Children in Year 3 or above who have received the Sacrament of Baptism are able to make their Reconciliation. This will be followed by the Holy Communion Program in the next term.




PARENT INFORMATION NIGHT

A reading from the letter of St Peter

Blessed be God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who in his great mercy has given us a new birth as his sons, by raising Jesus Christ from the dead, so that we have a sure hope and the promise of an inheritance that can never be spoilt or soiled and never fade away, because it is being kept for you in the heavens. Through your faith, God's power will guard you until the salvation which has been prepared is revealed at the end of time. This is a cause of great joy for you, even though you may for a short time have to bear being plagued by all sorts of trials; so that, when Jesus Christ is revealed, your faith will have been tested and proved like gold - only it is more precious than gold, which is corruptible even though it bears testing by fire - and then you will have praise and glory and honour. You did not see him, yet you love him; and still without seeing him, you are already filled with a joy so glorious that it cannot be described, because you believe; and you are sure of the end to which your faith looks forward, that is, the salvation of your souls.

Jn 20:1-9

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you. 'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.' After saying this he breathed on them and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.' Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord', he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my



side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him: 'You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.' There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

The disciples are huddled in a room, 'for fear of the Jews'. Just a couple of weeks earlier they had been on top of the world. Jesus was enormously popular with the people, and the disciples, by association, were caught up in that affection. Their man, the one they had chosen to follow, was making waves and stirring the authorities – thumbing his nose at the rules. This, of course, made the disciples feel good to be around Jesus. However, in the space of just a few short days, their world had turned upside down. They'd already had an experience of the resurrected Jesus yet they were still hiding and afraid. Into this fear and uncertainty steps Jesus who says, 'Peace be with you'. It is a reminder of Jesus calming the storm out on the lake – in the midst of turmoil and anxiety he brings peace and calm. Thomas has received a pretty bad rap for the last 2000 years, forever labelled as 'Doubting Thomas' because he wasn't prepared to take someone else's word for the fact that Jesus had risen. However, despite his demand for evidence, once Jesus is before him, he abandons all his thoughts about placing his fingers in the wounds and proclaims, 'My Lord and my God!' This is an absolutely extraordinary statement of faith. For the very first time, someone recognises Jesus, not as Messiah, prophet or Lord, but as God. -Greg Sunter
